

CASE INFORMATION	CAN I COME TO CAMPUS?	DO I NEED TO BE TESTED?	WHOM DO I NOTIFY?
<b>You tested COVID-19 positive and have NOT been fully vaccinated.</b>	<p>No. You will need to self-quarantine for 10 days and follow CDC guidelines.</p> <p>After the 10 days, use the symptom checker daily to determine if you should return to campus.</p> <p>If you pass the symptom checker and have been fever free for 72 hours, please contact your supervisor to let them know you are ready to return to class.</p>	<p>You do not need to be tested again unless advised by your health care provider.</p> <p>However, according to the CDC, you should wear face coverings indoors in public for 14 days following exposure or until you have a negative test result.</p>	<p>Contact your supervisor at SPC. The supervisor will notify the campus Provost.</p> <p>SPC will initiate a cleaning protocol that may result in specific locations sanitized for 48-72 hours.</p> <p>Contact your supervisor for remote working options or HR for additional options.</p>
<b>You tested COVID-19 positive and have fully recovered within three months from COVID-19.</b>	<p>Yes. If you have no symptoms, you do not need to self-quarantine.</p>	<p>You do not need to be tested again unless advised by your health care provider.</p> <p>However, according to the CDC, you should wear face coverings indoors in public for 14 days following exposure or until you have a negative test result.</p>	<p>Contact your supervisor at SPC. The supervisor will notify the campus Provost.</p> <p>SPC will initiate a cleaning protocol that may result in specific locations sanitized for 48-72 hours.</p> <p>Contact your supervisor for remote working options or HR for additional options.</p>
<b>You tested COVID-19 positive 14 days (or longer) after being fully vaccinated, i.e. "breakthrough case"</b>	<p>No. You will need to self-quarantine for 10 days and follow CDC guidelines.</p>	<p>You do not need to be tested again unless advised by your health care provider.</p> <p>However, according to the CDC, you should wear face coverings indoors in public for 14 days following exposure or until you have a negative test result.</p>	<p>Contact your supervisor at SPC. The supervisor will notify the campus Provost.</p> <p>SPC will initiate a cleaning protocol that may result in specific locations sanitized for 48-72 hours.</p> <p>Contact your supervisor for remote working options or HR for additional options.</p>
<b>A household member or close contact tests positive.</b>	<p>Yes, if you have been fully vaccinated or have fully recovered from COVID-19 within three months and remain without COVID-19 symptoms.</p> <p>If you do not meet the requirements above, you will need to self-quarantine for 10 days. After the 10 days, use the symptom checker daily to determine if you should return to campus.</p> <p>If you pass the symptom checker and have been fever free for 72 hours, please contact your supervisor to let them know you are ready to return to class.</p>	<p>Whether or not you are fully vaccinated, if you have been around someone who has COVID-19 (exposed), you should get tested 3-5 days after your exposure (within 6 feet and for 15 minutes) even if you don't have symptoms, according to the CDC.</p> <p>You should also wear face coverings indoors in public for 14 days following exposure or until you have a negative test result.</p>	<p>Contact your supervisor at SPC. The supervisor will notify the campus Provost.</p> <p>SPC will initiate a cleaning protocol that may result in specific locations sanitized for 48-72 hours.</p> <p>Contact your supervisor for remote working options or HR for additional options.</p>
<b>Coworker, classmate, friend or casual contact tests positive.</b> Someone you were NOT within 6 feet of for 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period.	<p>You can come to campus as long as you do not have any symptoms and you were not in close contact.</p> <p>You should not come to campus if you feel ill. Use the symptom checker daily to determine if you should return to campus.</p>	<p>If no symptoms occur, you may not need medical care. You should continue to use the symptom checker daily to determine if you should return to campus.</p>	<p>No notification needed unless you become ill.</p>
<b>You feel ill and unsure if you have been exposed to COVID-19.</b> You have not been tested but feel ill.	<p>You should not come to campus on the day you feel ill. Use the symptom checker daily to determine if you should return to campus.</p>	<p>If no symptoms occur, you do not need medical care. You should continue to use the symptom checker daily to determine if you should return to campus.</p> <p>If symptoms occur self-quarantine for at least 10 days. It is also recommended you be tested.</p>	<p>Contact your supervisor for remote working options or HR for additional options.</p>
