JOB SUMMARY

This position is responsible for managing video production and television station operations. Duties include: prioritizing and scheduling production activities; participating in the conception and completion of academic and promotional video content; overseeing and coordinating mobile live-to-tape productions; working with the Marketing Department to promote the television station and content; and supervising assigned employees.

TYPE OF WORK

Work performed is primarily:

Very heavy work: Exerting in excess of 100 pounds of force occasionally and/or in excess of 50 pounds of force frequently, and/or in excess of 20 pounds of force constantly to move objects

WORK ENVIRONMENT
